

Aamodt Project Conducting Surveys In Tesuque Village

Surveys are being conducted in Tesuque Village related to the Pojoaque Basin Regional Water System (PBRWS) Project. This Project is a result of the Aamodt Agreement. You may have already seen survey equipment in the neighborhood or contractors visiting properties.

There are two types of surveys being conducted by different contractors for this project. The first is a Pipeline Alignment Survey that is used to select the exact route for the main and distribution pipelines and related equipment that are required to transport the water from its source ultimately to the consumers that are part of the system. The second type of survey will focus on Natural and Cultural Resources.

You may have been asked for permission for access to your property for one or both of these surveys. The granting of permission for access is a decision the individual property owner must make and most likely will have little or no affect on the project design or viability.

The PBRWS Project design stage continues in parallel with other activities related to the design of the management structure of the System and the decision by well owners and our own Tesuque MDWCA (Association) to decide whether our Members want to remain an independent Association or to join the Pojoaque Basin Regional Water System (PBRWS). The specific timing of our Members making this decision is not known, however, information important in you reaching a position will be communicated.

This communication is part of the Board's ongoing effort to inform our Members on issues related to the potential impacts of the Aamodt Agreement.
